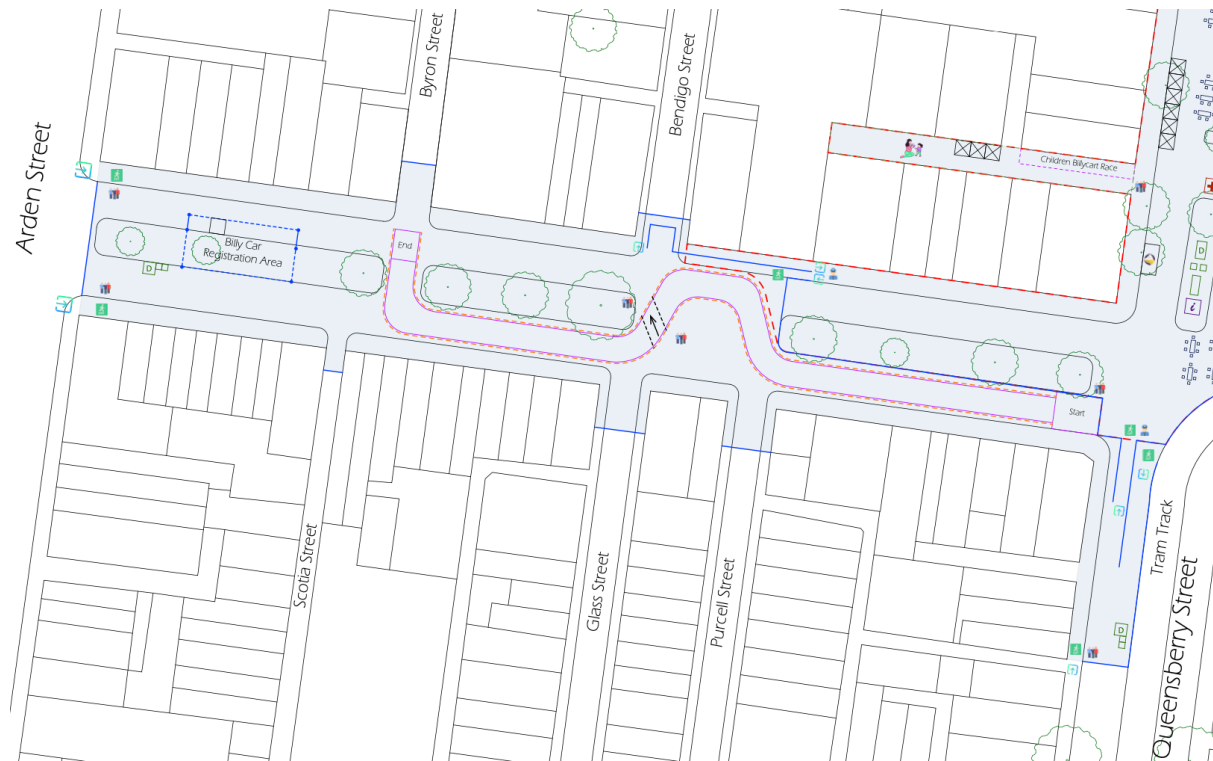
THE EVENT

The Queensberry Cup Billycart Challenge is produced by The Centre: Connecting Community in North & West Melbourne, with the assistance of many volunteers from the local community.

THE COURSE

Following feedback from participants in 2022, a new course has been designed.

Racers start on Errol St., north of Queensberry St. The course travels down the left-hand side of the road on Errol St., then curves onto the right-hand side, then back onto the left-hand side. After a straight section, there is a sharp right-hand turn between two grass verges, after which there is the stopping zone. The length of the course is approximately 166m. The course requires steering and braking. The slope is approximately 3.6%, significant, but not too scary.



START

There will be a small ramp with a holding gate. The cart gets placed on the ramp with its front against the starting gate. The driver enters the cart and lets the starting marshal know they are ready by saying "Ready".

When both drivers are ready, the starting marshal says "Ready... Set..."

On "Go", the race marshal will sound a horn and drop the holding gate for both drivers.

Drivers must stay in their lane for the first ~30 metres.

FINISH

The winner will be the first cart that comes to a complete stop entirely within the Finish Zone (approximately 5m x 5m).

CATEGORIES

- Open Category (anyone can enter)
- 7 to 11 year olds

- 12 to 17 year olds
- Corporate (can race in any of the above categories, depending on age of the driver)

ENTRY FEES

- Open Category: \$40
- 7-11 year olds: \$15
- 12-17 year olds: \$25
- Corporate: \$200 (\$200 entry fee includes up to three drivers, each driving the same vehicle separately)

ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries open on 17 July. You are encouraged to enter as soon as possible as there is limited capacity in each category. Online entries close October 20, 2023 at 5pm. Online entries can be submitted at <https://www.trybooking.com/CJYGP>

In person entries can be made at The Centre, 58 Errol St. during regular opening hours up until October 20, 2023, subject to availability. It is not possible to enter on the day.

VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS

All vehicles will undergo scrutineering on race day prior to being allowed on the course to ensure they are safe to race and that they comply with the vehicle requirements as stipulated below.

You can also get your billycart examined by the scrutineers on Sunday 15 October, 10am – 4pm at Melbourne North Service Centre (TBC). This is not the official scrutineering but could help builders adjust their vehicle to be compliant.

- Vehicles must be unpowered. No motor (petrol, electric or otherwise), and no pedal drive vehicles allowed
- Vehicles must have steering. Rope steering accepted (maximum pivot 22.5 degrees, refer to diagram)
- Vehicles must have a minimum of three wheels (3 or 4 recommended)
- Vehicles must have a brake mechanism that will allow the cart to finish the course safely
- No sharp exposed edges
- Must be a foot first driving position
- Maximum width 1100mm
- Maximum length 2200mm
- Maximum weight 50kg (without driver)
- Maximum wheel diameter: 500mm (rim to rim)

PLEASE NOTE: The head scrutineer has FINAL call over all decisions made. These rules are made for the safety of all concerned and for the integrity of the event.

DRIVER GUIDELINES

- Helmets must be worn. Helmets are to be of Australian Standard and can be an approved bicycle or motor bike helmet
- Long sleeves and long pants must be worn
- Gloves must be worn
- Closed shoes must be worn
- No unsecured or loose items allowed in the billycart
- Knee and elbow pads are recommended
- Mouthguards are recommended
- One person per billy cart - no tandems
- The same billy cart can be used by up to three drivers; however each rider must complete a separate entry. "Wild Cart Entry" bilycarts can have any number of drivers.
- No bumping into, or otherwise touching, another vehicle or driver allowed.
- No behaviour that could cause injury to another party allowed.

There will be first aid officers on site at all times.

JUDGES AND RACE MARSHALS

All judges and race marshals are volunteers; please treat them with respect.

The race judge has the power to disqualify or penalise a driver, to re-run a heat or final, to make alterations to these terms and conditions, to adjust the schedule or to abandon any part or all of the billycart race. Any such decision will be made in the interests of the event.

The judge's decision is final.

PRACTICE, HEATS AND FINALS

After scrutineering, billycarts will be required to do one test run on a shortened version of the course. This is to give the driver practice, but also to allow judges to determine if the cart and driver will be able to complete the full course safely.

If the judge determines that a cart and driver cannot complete the full course, the entrant will get an opportunity to race the shortened version again, but they will not progress to the official heats or the final.

Depending on available time, there will be an opportunity for entrants to drive the full course prior to heats. However, this cannot be guaranteed.

Each heat will consist of two drivers.

Each driver will compete in two heats, one commencing in the right lane, the other commencing in the left lane. Times will be recorded. Rank will be determined by the fastest time of the two runs, as long as they have acted within the rules on that run.

The drivers with the four fastest ranks will progress to the finals. Third will compete against fourth to determine minor placings. First will compete against second to determine the winner. Finals will be sudden death (one run only). First cart to come to a complete stop within the finishing zone will be declared the winner of the final, as long as they have acted within the rules.

If the same vehicle progresses to the final more than once (i.e., with different drivers), the driver with the fastest time recorded with that vehicle will be allocated a place in the final, and lower ranked drivers may be elevated to compete in the finals.

PERMISSIONS

By entering into the Queensberry Cup Billycart Challenge, you agree to the following:

WAIVER

I understand that entering the Queensberry Cup Billycart Challenge involves inherent risks. I am aware of the hazards involved, including but are not limited to: vehicle traffic, actions of competitors, spectators, race personnel, weather conditions and my physical and mental state of health. In my judgment I am physically and mentally fit and have sufficient competence and experience to participate safely.

In consideration of the acceptance of my entry, I hereby take action for myself, my executors, administrators, heirs, next of kin, successors and assigns as follows: I HEREBY WAIVE, RELEASE AND DISCHARGE from any and all liability for death, disability, personal injury, property damage, property theft and all other foreseeable risks, claims or actions of any kind (including negligence) whatever and however occurring which may arise, at any time, from or in connection with, directly or indirectly, my participation in Queensberry Cup Billycart Challenge the following persons or entities: The race organisers, race officials and personnel, land managers and/or owners, The Centre: Connecting Community in North & West Melbourne, event sponsors, volunteers, City of Melbourne and all of their respective officers, directors, employees, independent contractors, representatives, agents and volunteers.
